Living our Covenant of Right Relations: A Practicum Session 1: Sharing Personal Stories, Sunday, October 16 from 6-8pm in the Alliance Room

Niela and Steve will facilitate the first of this series of eight sessions to dicuss and practice ways to live FCU's Covenant of Right Relations. Please review the covenant in advance and come prepared to tell a brief story (just a few minutes long) about a memory that was elicited by reading it, perhaps a challenging experience that either ended well or remained unresolved. Your story could take place any time and place in your life, and be kept anonymous. If time permits, we will share the personal impact of these stories on us. If you can't think of a story, we will have a handout at the session which may stimulate a memory!

Our goals for the session are to:

- 1. Prepare for future sessions of moving into deeper specific practice
- 2. Establish a norm of sharing in a safe and non-judgmental space.
