As one of the items at last Spring's Goods and Services Auction, I offered a sermon of one's choice - and somebody even paid money for it! The request is that I speak to the nature of Atheism: What I think it is, and where it "fits" in the overall UU gestalt. To put in personal terms, if one goes by the most common understanding of the term, I would largely be considered an atheist myself; but it's still not a label I can quite claim. I'll offer my thoughts on what I consider an "honest atheism" to be - and the ways in which I do and do not resonate with it.

Primary & Elementary - Love Will Guide Us: "We Are Loved, Flaws and All"; Source Star—Sense of Awe and Wonder

We will reinforce the idea that despite human failings we are all loved and loveable; use games and crafts to transform apparent flaws into beauty, strength, or other positive attributes; understand the possibility of beauty in imperfection through a story, "The Scratched Diamond"; and explore ways a human characteristic we usually perceive as negative can also have a positive side, e.g., stubbornness can also be persistence.

Intermediate - Spirit of Adventure: "Medicine - Saving Lives and Learning First Aid"; UU Principle and Source: Be kind in all you do, help each other learn, and remember people whose lives remind us to be kind and fair.

We'll empower children to think of the safety of others as a way to care for the community, hear the story of Elizabeth Blackwell, Unitarian and first woman physician of modern medicine, and update our classroom 1st aid kits.

Junior Youth Group: "Breakfast Club" - Meets today.

Senior Youth Group - Meets in 2 weeks 11/6.

Next week - "A Day of Remembrance"; multigenerational worship service. Bring a photo or memento of a loved one (human or animal) for the altar we will create. The children will "Trick or Treat" for UNICEF during coffee hour. All are encouraged to come in costume.
