What this election has revealed is that there is a significant segment of our population that feels so alienated, so angry, and so disconnected from the mainstream, that the level of polarization within our nation is disturbingly high to the point of posing a challenge to our overall social fabric. This is the issue that will need to be addressed once this near unbearably election season comes to a close.

The Clearing Model—A Method for Resolving Conflict and Enhancing Connection.
