

Primary & Elementary - Love Will Guide Us: "Love is Accepting" This session focuses on the fourth Unitarian Universalist Source, expressed in children's language as "Jewish teachings which tell us to love all others as we love ourselves." The story from Hebrew scripture of Jacob and Rachel meeting for the first time highlights the importance of questioning gender stereotypes. UUs believe we should accept everyone as we would want to be accepted. Intermediate - Spirit of Adventure: "The Message in Christmas Music" Singing, playing and listening to music can help us focus on what we are experiencing right now. However, music can also connect out present to our past through our memories. Many Christmas carols were written by Unitarians who turned their fear and sadness into a message of peace on Earth, goodwill to all, which we are still working toward in this present day.
