

Digital Security 101 for Congregations: A two-part virtual training

Sponsored by Side With Love & Equality Labs Register.

Congregations are increasingly targets of online harassment, phishing, doxxing, and other forms of digital hate – often as a result of the ways we embody UU values in the world. Many of our UU communities do not have the skills and the infrastructure to protect themselves from malicious digital targeting. Equality Labs' Digital Security For All Workshop dives into digital security, and what that means for you and your organization. We will develop common ground and shed light on types of attacks and security concerns, engaging with you at a strategic level. We cover practical steps to mitigate online harassment, fraud, & other forms of cyber attacks. We look at how the data broker ecosystem coupled with open-source intelligence (OSINT) from social media increases security risks. We look at key preventions like data broker scrubbing, phishing awareness, multi-factor authentication, password management, & VPN that can be immediately applied. This training for teams of 1-5 is open to congregational leaders, especially those who manage secure information such as congregational websites, social media, databases, and communication. The \$100 includes both sessions and is required.
